

family a very Happy New Year and thank you for your good wishes. As you may be aware there is a teacher shortage in the city. We are 3 staff members short each day in school. Whilst this does not impact on our work, the children, rest assured, are our priority and we are delivering our very best at all times. We are timetabling carefully so that the children are receiving the very best. It is so important that they are in on time so they don't miss any class-time.

The teachers have changed some of your children's lunches. This is because they were not eating the food chosen for them. All of our meals are of the same nutritional value each day. If your child is not eating the school lunch, please be mindful that they are to bring healthy foods only as a replacement. We discourage lunches such as Nutella sandwiches, sausage rolls, chicken fillet rolls etc. and the children are allowed <u>only water</u> in their drink bottles. These are the rules issued by the Department of Education and are not of our making. If your child is not going to eat a school lunch, please let Helen know and it can be cancelled. Also, we have a number of children with a nut allergy, so this has an influence in the choice of foods allowed.

Please allow your children to walk in from the gate on their own. Scooting or cycling across the yard are not permitted, several children have been hurt because of this.

Parents are asked not to go directly to the classroom door to speak to teacher. A 1 to 1 meeting can be set up but the class would needs supervision organised first, thank you. You can also leave a message with Helen or contact teacher through Aladdin.

Could I please ask parents not to encourage the use of chewy toys or weighted blankets unless recommended by a professional clinician.

Coffee Mornings for parents will be resuming this month. Ms. O'Keeffe will be in touch. Our $1^{\rm st}$ Coffee Morning is for Grandparents Day, as part of Catholic Schools Week on Friday $27^{\rm th}$ January
